

Key Vocabulary - Invade, raid, settlement, significant, Interpret, monarchy, longship, kingdom.

In **maths** we will be continually revising our times tables and appreciate your support with this at home. We will be starting a new topic on Fractions and then moving into the first stage of decimal work. Key Vocabulary - Numerator, denominator, fraction, multiply, mixed number, Improper, decimal

In science we will be exploring Animals Including Humans and completing a range of experiments based on this to develop our scientific skills. We will explore our digestive system and also our teeth.

PE will take a focus on Hockey and Netball. It will be beginning to warm up hopefully, but coats and warm clothing will still be needed.

In **RE** we will be exploring the big question 'Why do Christians call the day Jesus died the Salvation?'
