Meeting national curriculum requirements for swimming and water safety (July 2022)

As directed, due to exceptional circumstances priority was given to ensuring that pupils can perform safe self-rescue even if they do not fully meet the first two requirements of the NC programme of study. Targeted pupils had additional swimming lessons in Y6 term 6 in order to secure this.

Equipment for them organised and moved closer to the MUGA. • Children sent to a range of interschool competitions: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Year 5/6 Rugby Festival. - Year 1/2 Rugby Festival. - Year 5/6 Cricket Festival. - Year 1/2 Rugby Festival. - Year 5/6 Football Tournament. • Wide range of after school clubs: boxing, tennis, multisports, rounders, netball, Irish dancing, athletics, football and netball. • Netball and football fixtures completed. • Race for Life event held. • Sports day held and parents attended. • Tennis CPD attended resulting in £250 equipment free to school, all being used in T6 as all classes teach tennis (as Wimbledon is on) and tennis equipment out at playtimes and lunchtimes for chn to use. • KS1 and KS2 Football Festivals happening in July in line with the Women's Football European Championships. • Years 5 and 6 received a term of cricket coaching with Jamie from Chance to Shine. • Year 6 attended the Kent Cricket Schools Day out. • Years 2-6 took part in the Swale Virtual Sportshall Athletics with all chn taking part receiving certificates and some classes coming in the top 3 in Swale. • Tickets acquired and families attended Basketball Finals. • PE shed being organised (July) so it is easier and safer to navigate. • PE Big Book started that shows evidence of lessons, competitions and children's views on them. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Daily mile to be set up and embedded in school life. • Wake and Shake to be introduced. • Playtimes and lunchtimes to be structured more for all chn. • Children and staff to be surveyed about PE and schools sport. • Attendance to school clubs to be collated (2021-22) and numbers to be increased for 2022-23. • Increase swimming allocation (several pupils missed their swimming allocation due to ongoing covid absence and therefore swimming stats are low)
