## Our topic in term 6 is 'Under the Sea'

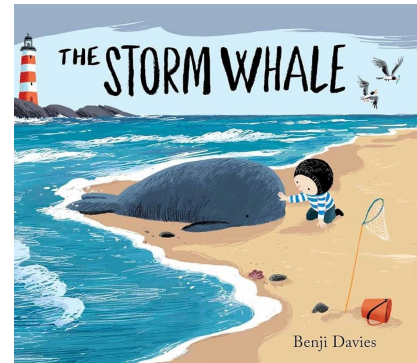
In **Understanding of the World**, the children will begin to learn about the sea and what lies beneath it; including plants and sea creatures. Looking at coastal areas, near and far, they will know what a rock pool is and what they will find living inside. The children will learn about the seaside past and present. We will also explore the season of summer and reflect on our year in Acorn Class.

In **Literacy**, we will continue to read a range of books linked to our theme but we have also started a new Literacy scheme called 'Read to Write' We will read the text 'The storm Whale' and will focus on writing grammatically correct sentences and the use of description and adjectives during poetry. Independent writing and correct letter formation will be our focus for this term as we begin to assess the children for the Early Learning Goals.

In **Maths** this term, we will be continuing to master a secure understanding of numbers to 20 and beyond. We will continue to consolidate our addition skills through number bonds and adding two or more numbers together to make a total. Also practising subtraction. We will encourage the children to identify patterns in numbers when learning about doubles, grouping, halving and odd and even numbers. Please do log in and help the children to practise on NUMBOTS. The login was given out at parents evening.

In **Expressive, Art and Design**, the children will begin to plan, complete and evaluate their own creations using a range of different textured materials. They will look at the work of the artist 'Alfred Wallis' and attempt to create their own version of his work 'The Blue Ship'

In **RE**, we will continue to explore the question 'Why are stories special to people?' We will learn about special stories in different religions.

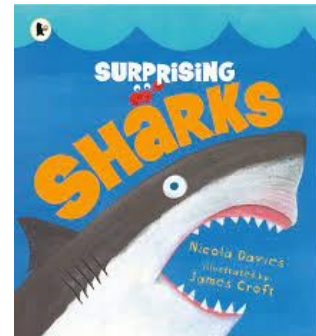
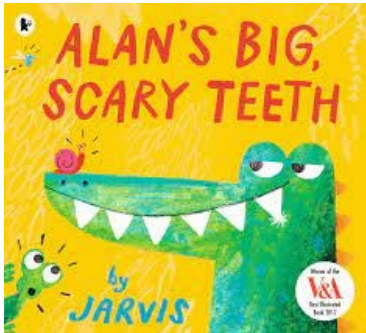

Acorn class are still deciding on how to raise money and we will update you soon! We hope you will be able to support us in some way.

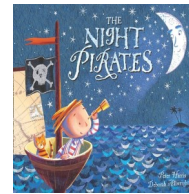
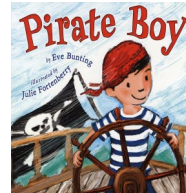
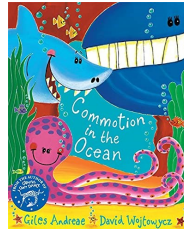
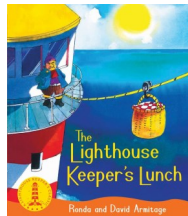
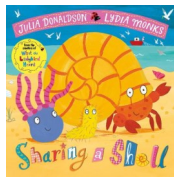
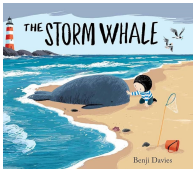
