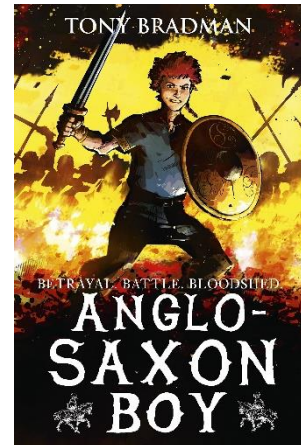


Term 2 Hawthorn Celebration Newsletter!

Term 2 has flown by and we are now looking at Term 3. This term has been a wonderfully history driven term which has linked across our curriculum. Next term, we hope to continue to inspire the children through their history learning even more.

Coming up in Term 3!

Our new class text will be *The Anglo-Saxon Boy*. We will be using this book to form a basis for our **English** learning. In English we will be looking at writing narratives, writing historical recounts in the form of newspaper articles, writing consistently in one tense and using diary entries as a format for this. We will continue to develop our descriptive techniques. We will use the book to support our spelling, punctuation and grammar learning too.



We will then continue to learn about The Anglo Saxons in our **history** lessons. We will look at why the Anglo-Saxons settled, their biggest successes and how they traded and raided! We hope to have lots of hands on learning for this unit!

Some Historical vocabulary – chronology, traders, raiders, invade, settlement

In **maths** we will be continuing with exploring multiplication and division. We will continue to present this in a variety of forms, both practical and written to encourage a deeper level of learning. We will also explore perimeter and length.

In **science** we will be exploring sound and completing a range of experiments based on this to develop our scientific skills.

PE will take a focus on Dance and will spend the majority of lessons in the hall. It would still be useful to have trainers and a coat on PE days.

In **RE** we will be exploring What kind of world did Jesus want?
