## Curriculum information

### Our topic in Term 2 is 'Terrific tales and Celebrations'



In **Communication and Literacy** this term, we will be thinking about our favourite stories. These may include traditional fairy tales or other stories your child always goes back to. We will be performing some of our favourite stories using repetitive phrases and actions, creating our own story maps and learning about what a traditional tale is. You will definitely know some of these! We will continue to learn more phonemes in phonics and practise blending to read simple words and captions in our story books. In writing, we will focus on practising our names and correct letter formation. Also continuing drawing club, and learning to write labels and captions to accompany our pictures. Please talk and share with your child some of your favourite stories. Maybe take a visit to the library!

In **Maths** this term, we will continue to practise subitising and learn how to find one more and one less than a given number. Also to add and subtract practically. We will begin to find various ways to represent numbers 1 to 10. Our learning will be reinforced by the 'number blocks' which is a great programme that supports the Early years maths curriculum.

**Understanding of the World**—We will continue to learn about the world around us through celebrations such as Diwali and Christmas. Also learning about Remembrance. These provide lots of opportunities to be creative in **Expressive, Art and Design** too. We will begin to experiment with different colours and textures and explore different instruments in **Music**. In **RE** the children will begin to know what Christians say God is like with the help of Tom and Tessa

### Phonics and Early Reading

We will continue to send home the Phonics home learning on a **Wednesday** along with a new reading book. As part of whole school policy, we would like the children to read/share their reading book at home too. Please do initial or comment in your child's reading contact book.

'Sharing books' to read for pleasure with your child, will be sent home on a **Thursday** or **Friday**.

We are holding a handwriting workshop on **Thursday 7th November** at 2.30 if you would like to find out more about how we teach writing and handwriting in school.

### Things to look out for in term 2...

- We are planning a visit to Sittingbourne Library.
- We are preparing for our very first Christmas Nativity. Dates to follow.

### How can you help at home?

- Practise putting on jumpers and coats independently ready for the cold weather.
- Practise using a knife and fork.
- Share and discuss stories every night.
- Sing nursery rhymes and other short songs
- Listen and discuss sounds around you e.g. animal sounds, everyday sounds etc.
- Emphasise initial sounds of words i.e. c for cat
- Practise recognising and writing your name.
- Can you write short 3 letter words that we have practised in Phonics.
- Count daily and look out for numbers in your home.
- Create a rocket 'Firework' using junk modelling materials around the home.
- Write a letter to Father Christmas.
- Act out your own story for your family
