Our topic in term 5 is 'Journeys'



In **Understanding of the World**, we will be starting this term by looking at the variety of countries we have already visited on our holidays. If you have any postcards, photos or souvenirs from previous holidays we would love for you to share these on DOJO so we can discuss them with your children. Each week our class bear 'Ted' will travel to different places within the UK or around the world. We will see what he decides to pack in his suitcase and how he travels to the destination. We will be learning about the different ways of travelling, showing how we can travel around the world and where places are situated in the world.

In **Literacy**, we will continue to develop our Phonic knowledge by recapping Phase 3 sounds and moving on to Phase 4. We have some wonderful stories to share with the children to stimulate discussion, story telling and opportunities to have a go at writing labels, captions and sentences. Our big focus this term will be to write independently using their phonic skills and so their writing can be read by others. We will expect correct letter formation to be used too.

In **maths** this term, we will be continuing to master a secure understanding of numbers to 10 and beyond. We will develop our addition skills through number bonds and adding two whole numbers to make a total. Also move on to subtraction. We will be helping the children to develop their mental maths skills and fluency. Please do log in and help the children to practise on NUMBOTS.

In **Expressive, Art and Design**, the children will be exploring the instruments and following a musical pattern. Then beginning to create their own music!

Next term we hope to take the children on a real journey out of school on another school trip to Curly's farm.

Reading



This term we will continue to use phonetically decodable reading books matched to the children's phonic ability based on this term's assessment. You will notice that the number of words on a page increases and we now like the children to try and read the whole sentence back with increased fluency. Knowing the tricky words really helps this skill too. Tricky words will continue to be changed weekly but will be on various days so please keep them in your child's book bag.

Please remember to sign your child's book when you have read with them as we do monitor the reading at home. Aim to read with your child 3 times. All children must bring in a bag so the reading book can be sent home.

Please remove earrings on these days.

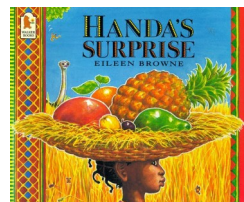
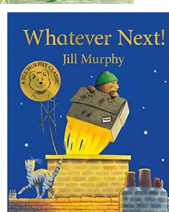
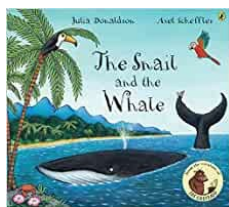
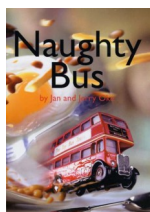
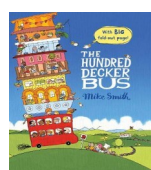
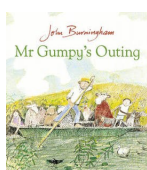
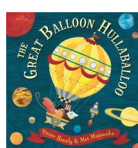
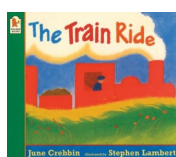
Reception Knowledge Organiser
